# The humanitarian response plan is aimed at helping 11.1 million people in Ukraine

- In 2023, approximately 3.9 billion dollars will be needed to ensure that 652 humanitarian organizations will be able to provide their aid

# Assistance from international organizations in Ukraine was received From February 24 to December 15, 2022

- **13.5 million citizens, including:**
- 2.4 million people were provided with shelter and basic necessities
- about 630 thousand people were provided with clothes, heating devices and other goods
- 6.9 million citizens were provided with water and hygiene items
- 8.9 million were provided with food products
- 8.9 million people received medical services
- 4.3 million people got cash assistance.
